
Tasks, a job, a life, that are not goal oriented are just processes and, while they may be comforting, they don't lead anywhere.

Reimbursement Network Announcement**

Are you interested in taking a computer class? Do you take classes for Continuing Education credits? Would you like to get reimbursed for some of the expenses? As an ABWA member of LAEN, you can. SBMEF is the way

The Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund (SBMEF) exists to provide educational grants and scholarships to women pursuing post-secondary educational goals as well as ongoing professional development in order to support their career advancement and to help them become the role models, mentors and leaders of the future. It is one of the

country's most highly respected grant and scholarship funds for women. SBMEF has been supporting businesswomen for more than 50 years. The fund assists women pursuing advanced educational goals enabling them to achieve business and professional success.

The SBMEF Business Skills Tuition Reimbursement Program (BSTR) provides working women an opportunity to participate in professional development workshops and/or seminars offered by an accredited, licensed, or state-approved institution in the United States. Coursework such as ABWA-KU MBA Essentials, Park University's Women as 21st Century Leaders, Rockhurst University and FranklinCovey offered at ABWA nationally sponsored events and/or other programming like real estate license and desk top publishing are examples of non-degree coursework that would meet the course criteria for a BSTR. Deadline for Business Skills Tuition Reimbursement is June 1, 2016.

Guidelines

- The sponsoring league must be in good standing (liability insurance premium paid and the league's officers, committee chairs and committee members must be current with their national and local dues).
- To sponsor a BSTR, the league must contribute a minimum of five-hundred dollars (\$500) to SBMEF during the previous award year (August 1, 2014 through June 1, 2015).
- The league is limited to a total Business Skills Tuition Reimbursement amount not to exceed fifty-percent (50%) of the league's contribution to SBMEF in the previous Award Year. For example, if a league contributed one-thousand dollars (\$1,000) to SBMEF in 2014-2015 Award Year, then it may apply for five-hundred dollars (\$500) in Business Skills Tuition Reimbursement in the 2015-2016 Award Year.
- The league may also sponsor multiple BSTRs as long as the total amount requested does not exceed fifty percent (50%) of their total contribution to SBMEF.

Applicant Eligibility Requirements

- ABWA members and non-members may apply for a BSTR.
- The applicant must be a female, U.S. citizen.
- The coursework must enhance an applicant's career objective.
- The applicant must have completed the course prior to submitting her application for a BSTR.
- An applicant must apply for a BSTR within 90 days after course completion.
- The applicant must complete the online application process including; a course

description, rationale for attendance, and verification of the institution's or organization's credentials and provide proof of payment.

- An applicant may receive multiple Business Skills Tuition Reimbursements (BSTR) each Award Year from multiple leagues.
- When a BSTR is awarded, the recipient may receive an amount up to one half of the tuition and/or up to a maximum amount of \$500 each award year.
- The minimum amount awarded for a BSTR is fifty (\$50) dollars.
- No applicant is guaranteed a BSTR.


